
In family theatre news:

Bye Bye Birdie Opening Night is January 13th! Do YOU have YOUR ticket yet?

The week before opening night has various names among us theatre geeks but the one that I can print herein is simply "tech week". Named because this is typically the only week that a full stage crew gets to bring all of the effects together with the actors and, if everyone makes it through this week, they reward themselves with opening night! So here's a sneak peek at some of the people who have come together to entertain you.

Shelley Hayes is directing this classic. And although this is her directorial debut, you have seen her on stage in numerous shows here at OPCT since 2001 including *The Addams Family, Phantom – the Musical, Carousel* and her personal favorites – *Gypsy and Heartbeats*.

Josh Katzman will transform into Albert Peterson in his first leading role! He was last seen on our stage as Vinnie in *Lucky Stiff*. Josh is originally from New York City and holds a degree in the Performing Arts. He has performed in almost 40 productions in NYC, New Jersey and Florida. His favorite theatre credits include: *Guys and Dolls* (Nicely-Nicely Johnson), *Fiddler on the Roof* (Motel), *The Music Man* (Marcellus Washburn), *Oklahoma* (Jud Fry), *Oliver!* (Mr. Bumble) and *Gypsy* (Herbie).

Jennifer O'Brien has taken on the role of Rosie for this production and will be sharing the stage with her daughter, Jordan, for the first time! She has an Associate's Degree in Musical Theater from Florida School of the Arts. Jennifer was most recently seen in *Mary Poppins* at OPCT and in the ensemble of *Memphis the Musical* at Players by the Sea. Favorite performances have included roles in *A Chorus Line* (Connie,) *Guys & Dolls, South Pacific* (Bloody Mary,) and *Oklahoma* (Aunt Eller.)

Karen Coughlin is so excited to be performing for the first time on the Orange Park Community Theatre stage as Mrs. MacAfee! She has been singing and performing in plays and musicals since she was 7 years old. Some of her favorite roles include, *Lil' Abner* (Daisy Mae), *Grease* (Sandy), *Home For Christmas* (Norma) and *Grease* (Marty)

Samantha Jenkins is very happy to be playing the role of Kim MacAfee for this show. This is not the first time Sammie has taken to the stage at OPCT – in fact, this Douglas Anderson School of the Arts Musical Theatre sophomore student is making her fourth appearance.

Tim DeBorde is the Musical Director for this show. Over the years he has appeared on the stage in such productions as *Little Shop of Horrors, Phantom - the Musical, How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying;* Directed *The Addam's Family, Insane with Power, Pirates of Penzance, Carousel.* In short, this page isn't long enough to list all of his shows but if you've seen more than two shows at OPCT, you've seen his work.

Greg Barnes, with this production, finishes out his triple play. This is the third play at OPCT in a row this year that he has stage managed! A true "Iron Man" of the OPCT techie crowd – stage crew everywhere bow down to him!

Choreographer is Missy Losure. Orchestra Director is Charlie Mann. Producer is Vicki Lowe. Cast Organizer and "she who must be obeyed" is Sally DeBorde. Costumes by Sandy Summerton and Regina Manning.


Both groups will be performing Beauty and the Beast Jr. on separate weekends.

Last month, I was unavailable to write a full column due to an intense amount of studying for the five exams and six projects that had to be completed in the span of the final two weeks of the semester, while also assisting with a Broadway dance master class. Needless to say, I was exhausted. But now, after a few weeks at home and a week spent in New York City, I am ready to return to my classes, better than ever!

When I explain to people that I am majoring in stage management, I get a lot of funny looks. How exactly does a person go to school for that? Do I just sit around all day and watch recordings of shows and practice calling light and sound cues? Nope! My head professor's motto is that to make it in the big leagues, you have to know everything about the theatre – so that's exactly what we learn. Last semester, my classes included Stagecraft, where I built all the sets for our productions – it was exhausting; Stage Electronics, where I learned even more about lighting and sound design (thank you Tim DeBorde for all of the lessons of the past – they really gave me a head start) and I learned how to solder circuit boards; Acting One, which is pretty self-explanatory; Survey for Theatre Majors, which functioned as an introductory course to everything in the theatre world, especially on how Theatre UCF works; and Introduction to Stage Management, where, yes, we did spend a week watching a recording of a show and practiced calling cues.

The last few months were absolutely exhausting, but my passion and my drive have not left me yet. Alright, that's all for now. Break legs to the cast and crew of Bye Bye Birdie, I wish you all the best! (And yes, I'm sneaking home just to see it!)

Until next month, I'll be downstage – just a few hundred miles further downstage than usual!
